## What Is a SARC?

All California public schools are required by state law to publish a School Accountability Report Card (SARC) by February 1 of each year. The SARC contains specific information about the condition and performance of the school from the previous school year.

Furthermore, under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), San Diego Unified is required to prepare a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), which describes how it intends to meet annual school-specific goals for all students, with specific activities to address state and local priorities. Data reported in the SARC are to be consistent with data reported in the LCAP.

## School Description and Mission Statement

University City High School (UCHS) opened in 1981 and is located in the heart of the University City community of San Diego, known as the "Golden Triangle." University City High School and the surrounding community schools work collaboratively with the parents and the community to create a rigorous academic program.

University City High School enrolls more than 1,800 students in grades 9 through 12. A diverse student population attends UCHS, with about 60 percent of the students living within the local school boundaries. Additional students enroll at UCHS through the Voluntary Enrollment Exchange Program (VEEP) and the School Choice program.

The mission of UCHS is to educate students to become productive and responsible citizens, who realize their full potential through lifelong learning.

As a community we expect UCHS graduates will be students who are:

- Active contributors to their community who give of their time, talents, and energy to benefit others
- Collaborative citizens who work well with people of different backgrounds and opinions
- Effective and knowledgeable communicators who are able to listen, read, write, think clearly, and respond appropriately to written materials and spoken language
- Independent critical thinkers and decision makers who can discern and solve problems creatively using prior knowledge and research skills

- Responsible planners who know how to set long-term learning and career goals

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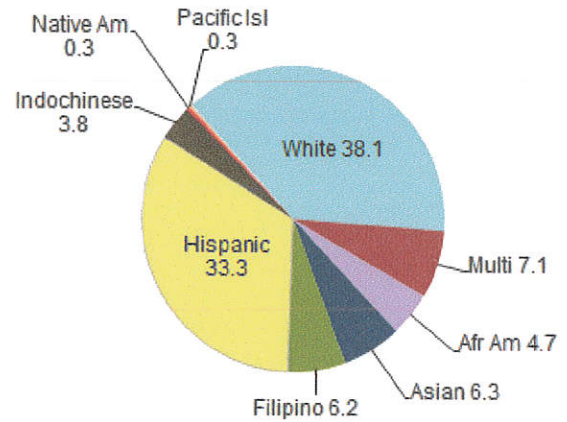
